Health Republic EOBs



A number of members have advised us that they are beginning to receive EOBs for previously submitted **Health Republic claims**.

Basically, you should review the EOB and if you agree, you do not have to take further action. You will be entered in the liquidation as an allowed creditor.

If you do not agree, their web portal has an electronic appeals process at www.healthrepublic.ny.org or call (866) 680-0893. The portal has a claims look up feature, FAQs covering the liquidation process, the EOB and appeals process.

Medicare Providers: MIPS: Data Collection

Empire EHPHC Providers Attribution: What is it and how does it work?

Attribution is the foundation for clinical coordination, care management payments, as well as shared savings calculations and any distributions. It is the method for identifying your <u>defined patient</u> population.

There are two processes used for attribution depending on the product type:

Open Access Products (PPO) – Attribution is based on historical claims data incurred in a 24-month period
 Products Requiring PCP Selection – Attribution is based on covered

 Products Requiring PCP Selection – Attribution is based on covered individuals' selection of a provider during a 12 month period

Insurance Company Non-Renewals

As you may know, under New York State law, health plans that terminate doctors must offer due process to appeal those decisions. New York State currently does not, however, require health plans to provide physicians with hearings for non-renewals. A new potential New York State law would provide physicians with the right to challenge non-renewals – not merely terminations – by insurance companies from their networks. The bill has passed the State Assembly and is now under consideration by the State Senate.
